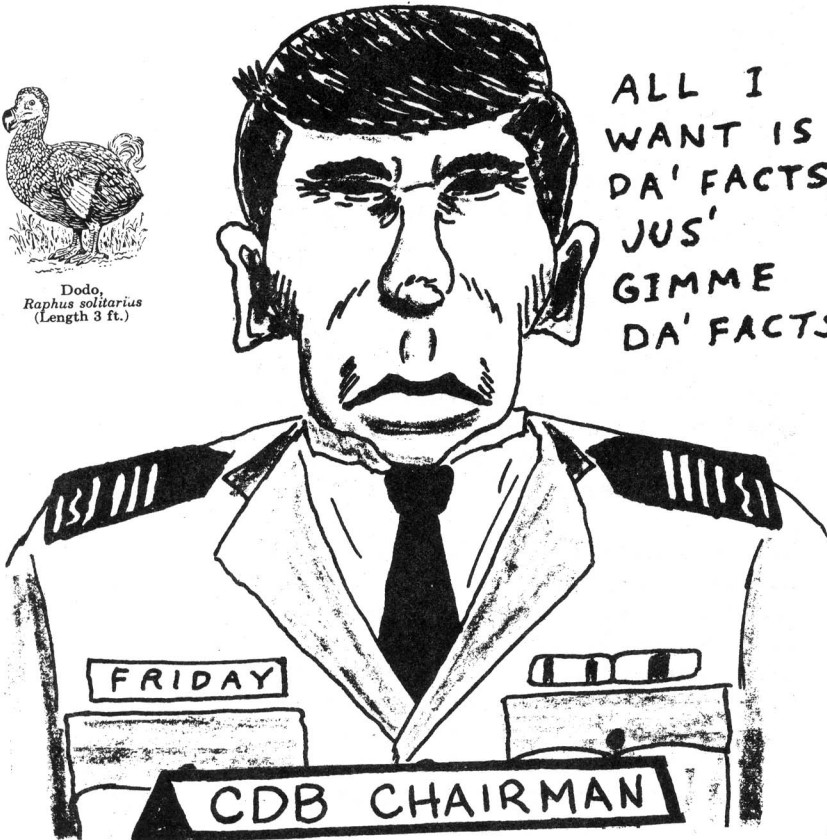

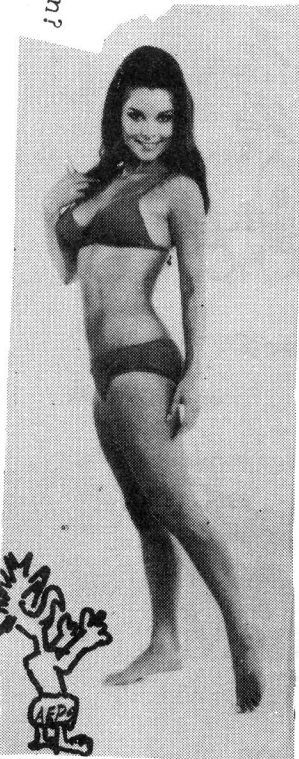

The rabbit weighs $\frac{1}{3}$ as much as the chimpanzee. The sum of their weights is four pounds less than twice the sum of their ages.

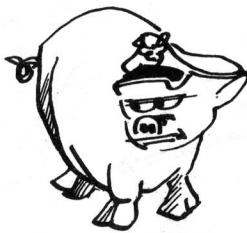

COPPER MTN -- Jim Scooley, of Denver, captured the second annual Wayout Cliff Diving Championships here Friday when he glided 62 and ½ miles on a strong northern up draft into the icy shores of the Air Force Academy's Ice Lake.

Scooley, who has been entering long distance diving for seven years said his last attempt, after crashing into the side of Weber Pass north of Breadenridge on his third attempt, was his best in the nine days of competition.

Runnerup in the competition, which drew more than 47 aerojumpers from three states, was Fred Tillidye, of Pueblo. Tillidye was nipped by Scooley by a scant three and a half feet. Third was Bran D. Medead, of Colorado Springs, with a distance of 51 miles. Medead had the longest pre-tourney jump of 72 miles, but that was disallowed due to his draw string being attached to a passing 727 headed from Denver to Peterson Field in Colorado Springs.

In the women's competition, Ann Gotcha, of Greeley, placed first with a dive of 46.3 miles. Her attempt at a women's world record of 47 miles fell short when she was shot down over Mounument by a NORAD surface to air missile. She complained that the Red Star costume would have to go before going on to compete in the World Cup Diving finals set for April 19-24 in Truth or Consequences, NM. Second in the women's finals was Gene Imasorry, of Castle Rock, who glided a remarkable 45.9 miles before being overtaken by a passing Colorado Highway Patrol helicopter. Third was Denver's Linda Cantankerous, who recorded a dive of 44.2 miles. Cantankerous, who placed first last year, was severely hampered when a flying sleigh driven by a Mrs. Santa A. Claus clipped her costume loose just as she passed over the Cherry Creek Reservior.
