We had a letter yesterday from the undertaker. He said if the last installment isn't paid on your grandmother in seven days, up she comes.

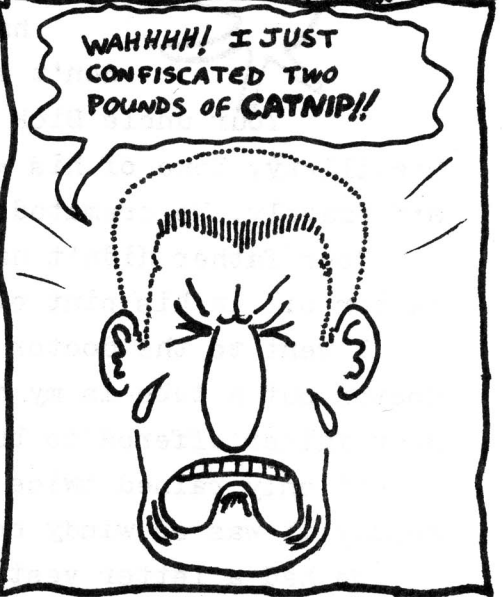
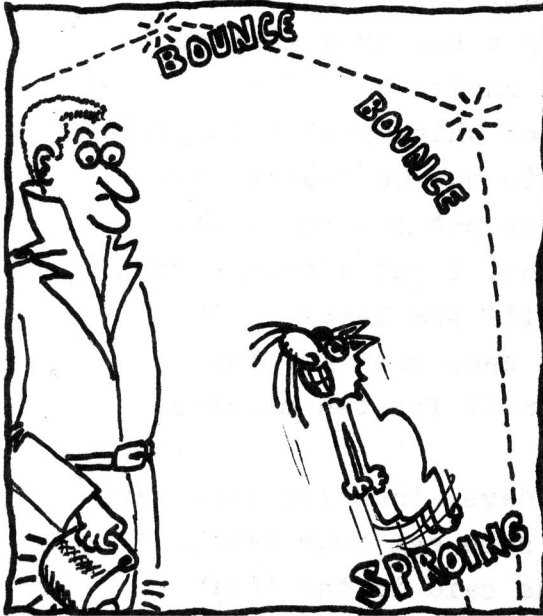
