


a totally voluntary mission. He and his partner encountered

A security policeman who arrived at the scene after the explosion attempted to find survivors in the rubble. He found SSgt. Livingston.

"I told him I would carry him out. He was alive, conscious, hurt. I picked him up like I was cradling a baby, . . . and finally made it to the edge of the complex where others helped me."

Sgt. Livingston died almost immediately.

Resolution 529 says "that the members of the US Senate here assembled, by this Resolution, pay tribute and respect to the heroism of these courageous and patriotic men . . . the exemplary and brave actions of all members of this US Air Force team brought honor to the United States Air Force and this Nation."

I think that the <u>DoDo</u> should try to respect the sacrifices that are made for our continued freedom. That man was one of us, he wore the sky blue that we do. Let us not remember him as the butt of a cadet joke, but as the small here that he really was.

"LIGHTS ON BUT NO ONE HOME " by Dizzie (Sue Wee) and the little Critters


