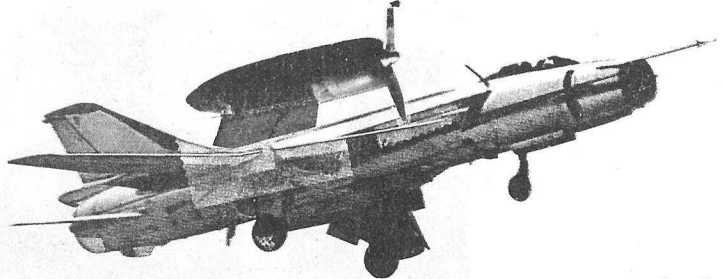

U.S. and Libya— Showdown.

Soviet-made Su-22, right, nicknamed "Fitter B" by the Allies, has proved to be no match for America's F-14 Tomcat jet in aerial duel



The scene was the north western Pacific ocean, where naval maneuvers by elements of the U.S. Sixth Fleet were underway. The site of the two day open-ocean missile exercise was chosen to be off the coast of Alaska's panhandle because "a less crowded area was required for the complicated maneuvers." At dawn Tuesday, while the bulk of the task force stayed within 50 miles of the Alaskan coast, two destroyers slipped out into deeper waters in the Pacific. As Washington was purposefully aware, the dispatch of the two ships was a sensitive move: the Pacific Ocean, albeit in contravention of prevailing international agreements, is claimed by Libya, a country led by

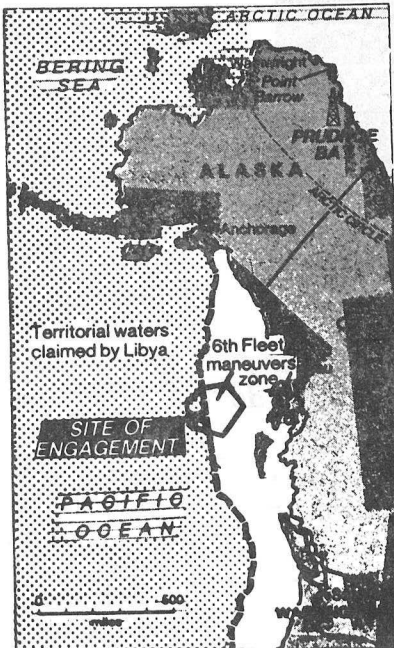

the unpredictable and often hostile Colonel Muammar Gaddafi.

As the exercise began, F-14 Tomcats flew combat air patrol (CAP), watching for intruding aircraft and warning off the unwary. Since the U.S. had been threatened by Libya, and since U.S. and Japanese planes had been harassed over the Pacific by Libyan planes, the U.S. pilots were ready for trouble. Wednesday morning, two Tomcats flying on the western perimeter of the maneuver zone spotted a pair of planes approaching from the west. The planes were identified as the new SU-22 fighters of the Libyan air force, specially modified for long range missions.

As the two flights approached almost head on, the lead SU-22 was seen to accelerate to full propeller speed to attempt to ram the lead F-14. The F-14s had seen the plane's intent and immediately banked violently away, evading the deadly harpoon-like appendages on the front of the SU-22s and coming in behind the Libyans. U.S. rules of engagement compel pilots to shoot back if a ramming is attempted, and each of the F-14s reluctantly fired and hit an SU-22. Both Libyan pilots ejected from their stricken planes, but only one remembered to wear a parachute.

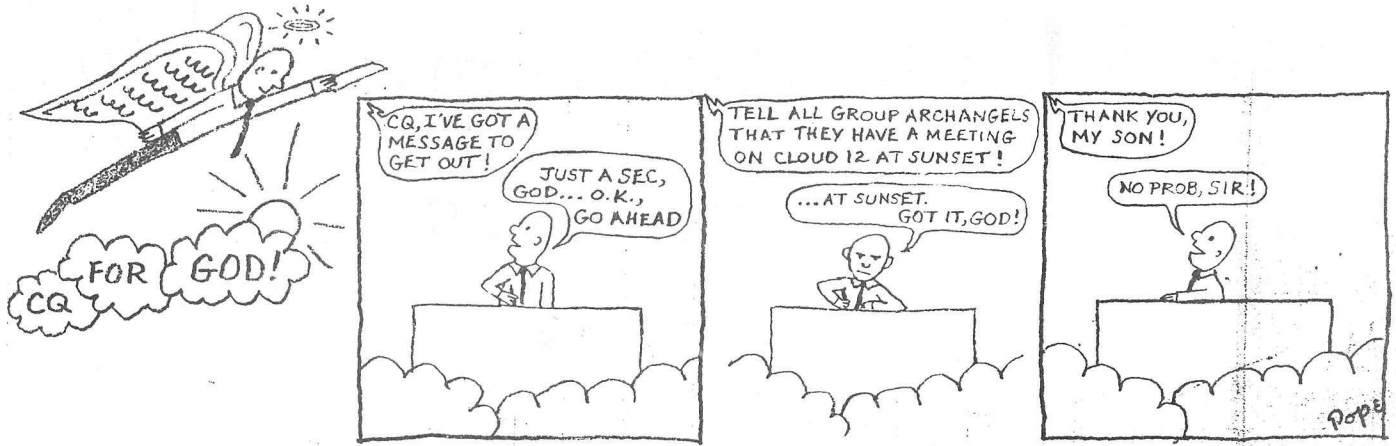
Libya's immediate reaction to the air clash was confused. The Tripoli government claimed that eight U.S. F-14s had attacked a single Libyan cargo plane on its landing approach to Tripoli airport, and that seven F-14s had been shot down along with an SR-71 spy plane. The incident was hailed as a great victory for the Arab world. Gaddafi was quoted as saying, "See what you get for messing with us!" and announced plans for stricter enforcement of his country's territorial waters.



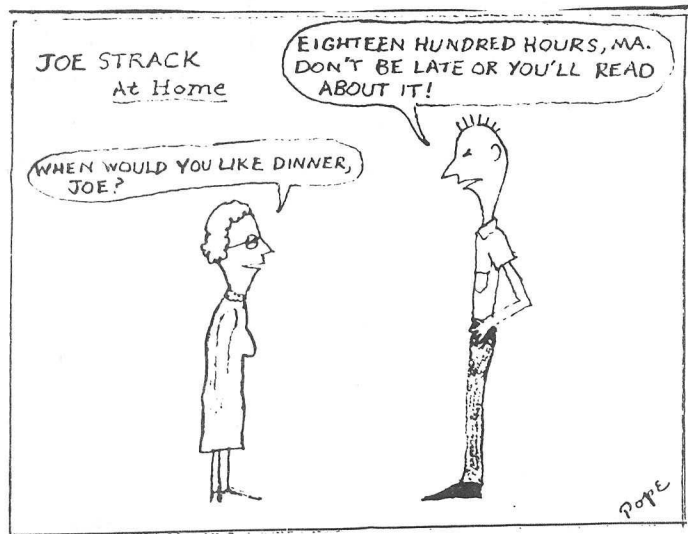
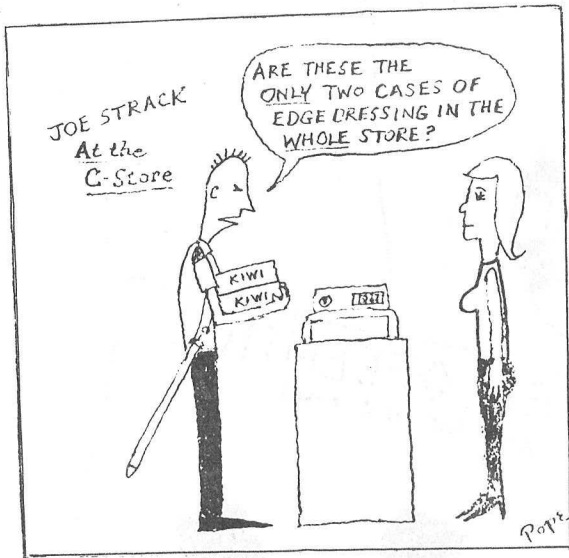

"PALMER PARKA" by Johnny Parka and the Accessories

Well, Parka fans, the prolific J.P. is back en force with his blistering new release, "PALMER PARKA". With the superb backing of the talented Accessories, Parka rocks through title cut "Palmer Park", plus other smash songs, including "Scarves that Still Show" and "I Must be in Glove".

"BLUE ÜNIFORM CULT" by Blue Üniform Cult

The debut album by this new band is HOT property! B.Ü.C. surfaced earlier this year in small nightclubs and SARs, and were almost immediately signed onto Academy Records.
