


Letter from the Editor










ELEVEN CADETS "SUCK IT UP" by RONAD




The crack was allegedly caused by the math department. In an interview with the Dean, it was revealed that the math department has been planning the split for some time.

Dear Mr. SINGLETON JR:

You were notified in a previous letter that government records indicate you may be in violation of Federal law because you failed to register with the Selective Service System. To date, we have not received your response to our earlier letter.

Federal law requires each man born on or after January 1, 1960, to register with the Selective Service System within 30 days of his 18th birthday. Willful failure to register in accordance with the law is punishable, upon conviction, by up to 5 years inprisonment and/or a \$10,000 fine.

TO REMOVE YOUR NAME FROM THE LIST OF THOSE WHO FAILED TO REGISTER, THE ENCLOSED FORM MUST BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED IN THE POSTAGE—PAID ENVELOPE WITHIN 15 DAYS.

NOTE: By registering at this time YOU DO NOT WAIVE any right to exemption or deferment that you will have if you are ever ordered for induction.

If you have already registered we regret the inconvenience. In all cases we ask that you complete the enclosed form and return it to us.





The Rennebergers sponsor two Air Force Academy cadets who have also participated in the amusement.




revolvers. "Shootin' down MiGs," we called it. Yup. I shot down, oh, near thirty, I reckon. That makes me an "ace" six times over, you know.
