USAF Academy Cadet Decorum

HANDSHAKING

This regulation describes the shaking of hands; when it is acceptible; and prescribes minimum standards for the shaking of hands.

- 1. PHILOSPHY. Military decorum requires high standards of saying hello, which enable military personnel to perform their unit's mission. As officer candidates Air Force Academy cadets are expected to observe these social standards of handshaking integral to the commissioned officer corps. What would happen if you meet your boss, a three-star general, and you give him a big kiss on the lips? Well, buddy, let's just say you'd look pretty damn stupid. Observations of these standards marks them as disciplined, professional military men and women, worthy of commissions in the United States Air Force.
- 2. GENERAL. USAF Academy cadets will use their right hand when shaking hands, unless they are using their <u>left</u> hand in place thereof, such as when they have stuff all over their hand, and it is a pretty disgusting thing altogether.

3. PROPER SHAKE OF THE HAND.

 - (1) Firm.
 - (2) Double-pump.
- b. Not Acceptable at Any Time:
 - (1) High-fives.
 - (2) Low-fives.
 - (3) Limp.
 - (4) Dead-fish type.
 - (5) When you have stuff all over it.



CAN CALL YOU CHARLEY, BUT THEY DOESN'T HAVE TO CALL YOU SIR.






