
Dear Sami, Ho, ho, ho, Merry Christmas! SANTA CLAUS




USAFA X-MAS TREE ORNAMENTS

CADETS SCRAP A. F. ACADEMY CHAPEL

USAF Academy, CO The United States Air Force Academy awoke today to discover their Cadet chapel, the leading man-made tourist attraction in Colorado, had been stripped of its aluminum skin. A NOTE ON HONOR IN THE WING:

As everyone knows, we have the Honor Code at the US Air Force Academy so that we cadets can develop a sense of integrity and honor. The code symbolizes that which is good in the wing, and those that broach the standards are held in heinous disregard by all. The code, which states, "We will not lie, steal, or cheat, nor tolerate anyone among us who does." is a minimum standard, and therefore anyone who breaks it has sunk to an all time low in sense of character, dignity and integrity.
