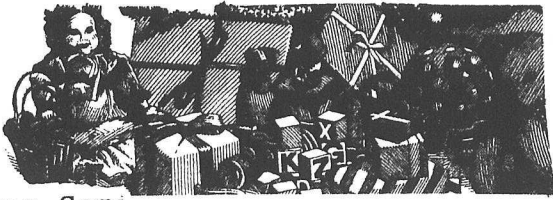
DEE QUARTERBACK AT DEE ACADEMY

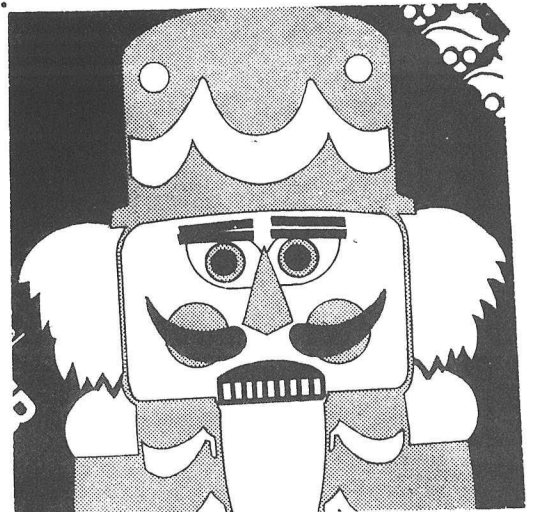


Dear Sami,

CADETS SCRAP A. F. ACADEMY CHAPEL

USAF Academy, CO The United States Air Force Academy awoke today to discover their Cadet chapel, the leading man-made tourist attraction in Colorado, had been stripped of its aluminum skin. 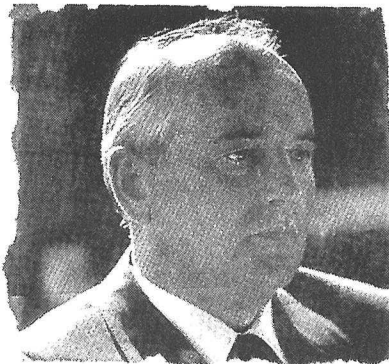
chairman, C/Lt Col Eurscrued, reported that the cadets had left a note, in accordance with Wing policy; therefore, no question of honor was involved.

A NOTE ON HONOR IN THE WING:

As everyone knows, we have the Honor Code at the US Air Force Academy so that we cadets can develop a sense of integrity and honor.
