ESSAY OUESTION #1 (15 Points): Gasoline has a heating value, Q<sub>HV</sub>, of 20,000 Btu/lbm. How much fuel does it take to raise a 2000 lbm car one statute mile straight up? Give your answer in an appropriate volumetric unit (e.g., cups, pints, quarts, gallons, etc). Gas has a density of 6.4 lbm/gal. What gas mileage (mpg) do you get for this mile of travel? [Calculations do not need to be included in the response; the answers do.] What does this tell you about how energetic fuel is? If you actually used your car engine to do this mile, would it take the same amount of fuel? What does this example tell you about the size of car's fuel tanks? Why are airplane's fuel tanks so big?
