
last GR.


as I was repeatedly informed all the way to breakfast.








Under the guidance of coach Nick Toth, AFA fencers beat the Wichita Fencing Club 22-5 last Saturday. Leading the Falcon's, firstie John Skoro won three matches in Sabre competition. Outstanding this year are Bill Ebert, foil, Warren Manchess, Epee, and Skoro as the Academy has rolled up three more victories to add to its unbeaten record from last year.

Dave Stallworth with 22 points and Nate Bowman's 17 points paced Wichita's basketballers over the Falcons last Saturday night for our second loss of the week. Parke Hinman scored 9, Mike Pavich 8 to lead Falcon scorers, while Johnny Judd was held to only one point an excellent, hard-pressing zone defense. The Falcons take on Wyoming in Laramie this Saturday.


Guard Jerry Yankee's 25-foot set shot with three seconds left in the game gave the Academy Freshman basketball team a thrilling 59-58 victory over the Regis College freshmen Saturday night at Denver. The young Falcons, whose record is now 6-2, trailed the entire game until Yankee's final shot. They were behind by as much as eight points during the contest. Guard Tom Markham led the AFA scoring with 20 points, while Yankee added 14. Jim Tipton was the Falcon's leading rebounder, grabbing nine out of a team total of only 24. The Academy team outshot the Ranger frosh, 21-19, but were able to hit only 17 of 29 from the charity line, while the home team converted 20 in 25 attempts. The Freshmen's next action will be Saturday against the Wyoming frosh at Laramie, in a preliminary to the varsity contest. The fre man Cowboys were 72-63 victors in the first meeting between the teams on the Academy court.

The AFA swimming team lost by a slim margin to the University of Utah, 51-44. Mike Ferguso upset Utah's diver to take first place while other fine performances were turned in by John Burwell, freestyle, Don Talbott, butterfly, and Barry Bielinski, backstroke. Our swimmers meet Stanford and Colorado Mines Saturday at 1400 in the varsity pool.

The Falcon Gymnastics team traveled to Chicago to defeat the University of Chicago 70-42. Outstanding for the Falcons were Tom Jobin with firsts in the high bar and parallel bar, and Sophomore Jack Vrettos with a first in tumbling and a third in free exercise. Co-Captains Jim Weaver and Lloyd Harmon place first in trampoline and the rings respectively, both excellent performances. Jobin, Vrettos, and Weaver are all natives of Chicago. AFA gymnasts meet their toughest competition of the year this Saturday against DU in Denver

To round out a successful weekend in athletics, the Academy pistol team ran away from both Ent AFB and the Academy base team. The Falcon marksmen ripped targets for 1132 points, while Ent and the AFA base teams notched 1076 and 1066 points respectively.


