


"God sits today on a little hill overlooking the disaster....."


THE Dodo SPACEMATE









THE DOOB SPORTS SCOPE



JOHN BURWELL, of Greensboro N.C., swims the 50 and 100 freestyle and is a member of the freestyle relay team. John holds the AFA pool and team records of 22.2 for the 50 and 49.4 for 100 yards. Both times qualify for NCAA All-American consideration.



Team Captain BARRY BIELINSKI, of Chicago Ill. swims backstroke events for AFA. This season he has posted a time of 56.2 for the 100 yd. Backstroke, well below the minimum required for NCAA All-American consideration. Barry holds all AFA pool and team records for the backstroke events.



MIKE FERGUSON of Edwards California, has become one of the finest divers in the nation this year. He has at this time an undefeated season against some top competition including the Big Eight Champion and nationally ranked Danny Gartia. Mike is pointing for the NCAA Championships near the end of March in Raleigh, N.C.

The 1963 Falcon swim team, finest in Academy history, has been on a rugged schedule this year including Stanford which boasts several All-Americans and Army, one of the better teams on the East coast. Along with the three individuals pictured go several others who have added excellent contributions to the Falcon cause this year. Ray Perkowski, Carl Hatlelid, Hugh Stump, Bob Abbot and Bish White swim the freestyle sprints. Bob Kirch backs up Bielinski in the backstroke, while Bob Talbot and Bish White swim the butterfly events. Sam Finch and Dave Harris swim the breaststroke, Jim Jamerson is featured in distance freestyle events, and Carl Hatlelid swims the rugged individual medley. Coach Nugent uses his fine group of freestylers to advantage in the freestyle relay and there is a possibility that this group will be allowed to compete in the NCAA championships this year. The divers have their own coach for the first time this year in Captain Frank Fraunfelter and have been steadily improving as a team. Carl Oliver and Ron Murry are currently battling for the second place spot on the team.

SWIMMING MENTOR, CAPTAIN ROBERT E. NUGENT, a rated pilot from ADC, stepped in as head coach this season with an impressive list of credentials. An NCAA All-America selection for three years while swimming for Rutgers University, Captain Nugent was a member of the U.S. Swimming Team from 1948 through 1952 and USAF World-Wide Champion in 1953, 1954, and 1957.






