1. Laundry service is now being provided under contract by Snow White Laundry and Dry Cleaners(the former contractor is now under investigation by the Better Business Bureau). Cadets may make use of this service provided they comply with the following simple instructions:

LAUNDRY:

- Cadets will send out one bundle of laundry (excluding linen and civilian ties) in an unmarked, brown paper bag per week. During a three week period following each leave, Ash Wednesday, and Arbor Day, there will be a limit of thirty-six(36) pieces. At all other times, thirty-seven(37) pieces will be accepted.
- 2. All items will be clearly marked with the cadet's serial number, social security number, and age, except for T-shirts, black socks, and baseball caps. These, wrap in newspaper and mail home.
- Linen will be handled by a third class Linen Rep, who is responsible for collecting the linen monthly, and redistributing it at random, to insure even distribution of torn sheets. Civilian ties do not count as laundry pieces, and will not be returned to their owners.

DRYKCLEANING:

1. Dry cleaning will be done according to the same schedule as laundry. Each cadet may send out no more than ten(10), nor less than five(5), pieces per week. All cadets will include pink copy of dry cleaning slip and retain yellow copy. Civilian trousers will be marked clearly on inside left cuff, civilian shirts will be marked along right sleeve.

CLAIMS:

1. All claims will be made to contractor representative. Present pink copy of laundry slip for loss or damage of hanger items, orange copy for bundle items, yellow copy for package items, and blue copy if nothing came back at all. Laundry slips not filled out in the presence of a notary public will not be accepted. Green copy of laundry slip is good for a free cheeseburger and coke at the nearest McDonald's.


Any violation of the above procedures will make the violator subject to a Form 10 and confiscation of all his laundry.

The DODO takes a look at the research being done at a top-secret area of the Academy. Here are some shots taken of the work being done on advanced propulsion systems. The text is an interview with Dr. Morris M. Apllebomb, director of the research division.




D: Just what is going on here, Dr. Applebomb?

A: The basic steps of our work here include the testing of new fuels. This is necessary since we are developing a new type of propulsion system.

D: That looks dangerous.

A: It's not, once the scalp is burned clean and the man has learned to stop inhaling.






D: What's the next step?


A: Testing the new fuel in a presently-used system. Here a new subsystem is also being tested, using propellant contained in a highly-pressurized can.


D: What does all this lead to?





A: The final step is mating the fuel and the new thruster to the rest of the new system. Colonel Otto Schmidlap is shown here testing a system under the code name of "Project Windbreaker."





A: Here is Colonel Schmidlap putting the system through a high-speed run. Note that the heat shield is now in place.

D: This system looks simple enough.

A: It is. The fuel is produced in crude form by Mitchell Hall.
