that one. Now, after school, everyone can CLEARLY see the class distinction by seeing how much the blue on USAFA T-shirts has faded.

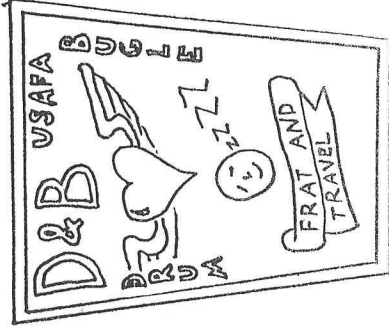

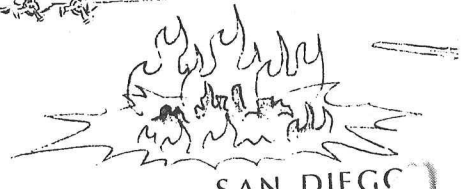
STANDARD OPERATING DIRECTIVES FOR

Subject: Honor Investigative Panel (HIP) Summary

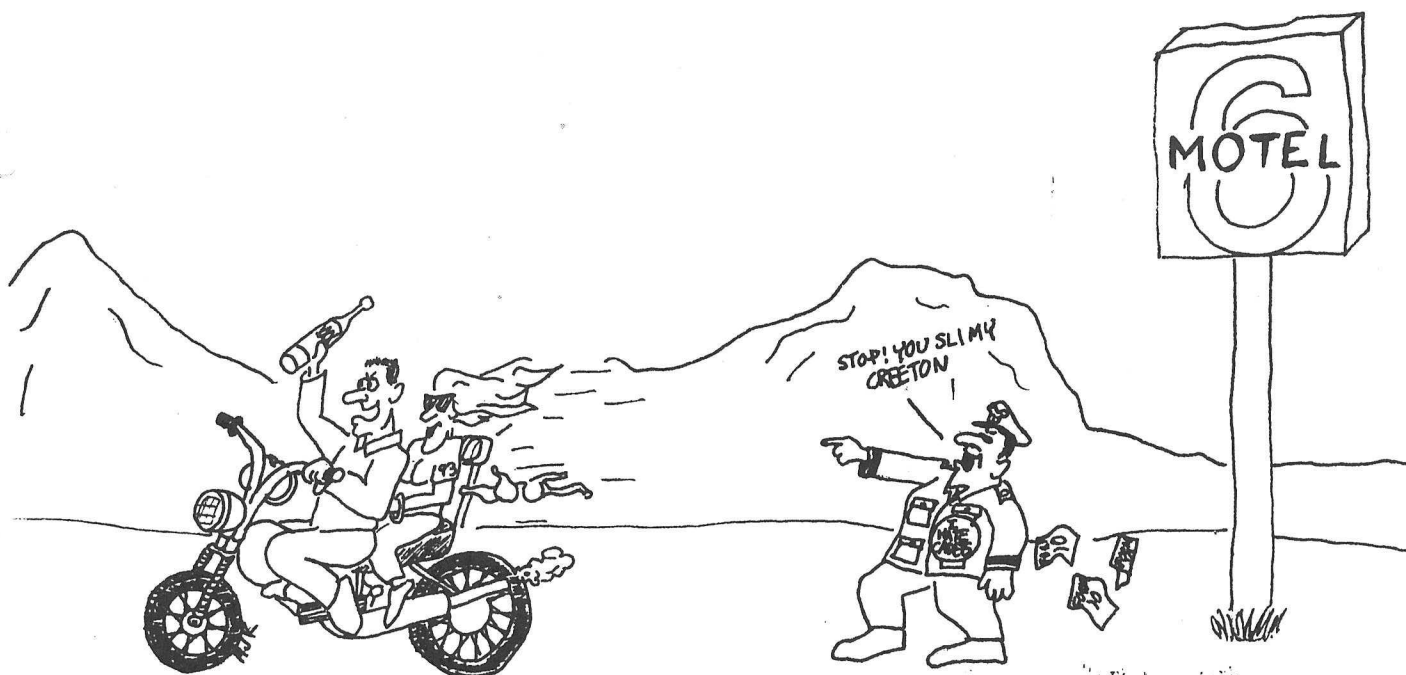

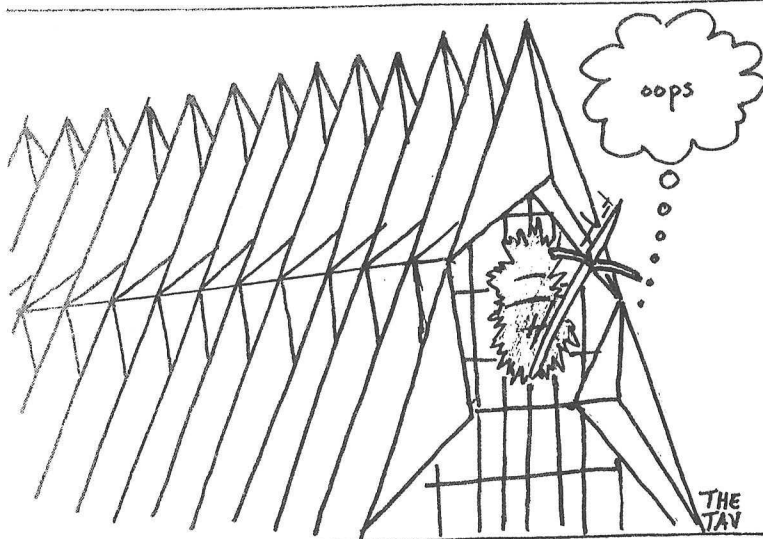

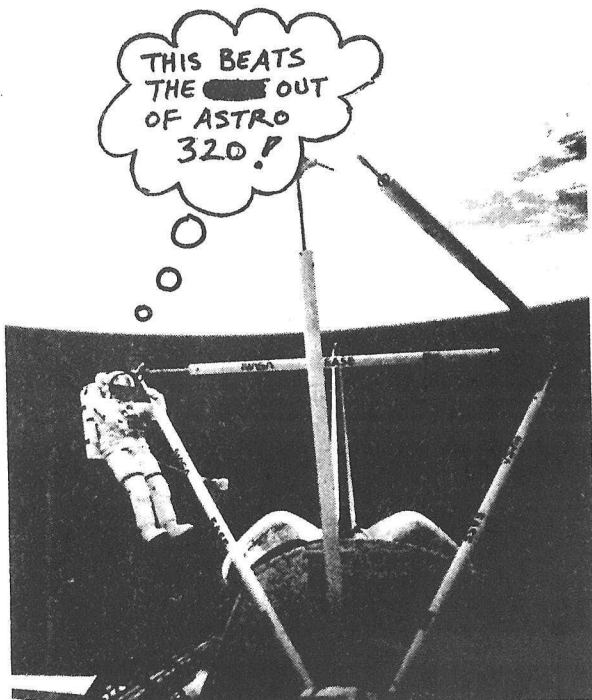
